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AmeriCares is a health-focused relief and development organization that responds to people affected by poverty or disaster.

Thanks to AmeriCares, Tracy was screened for surgery in Piura and able to travel the 15 hours to Trujillo to finally receive her palate surgery with GSF.

Born 3 months early, Tracy was only able to stay in the hospital for 15 days before she was forced to leave because her family could not afford the hospital bill. Her mother begged on the streets in order to feed her daughter. Tracy did not see a doctor again until she was three years old. She is now five years old.

This surgery means the world to Tracy and her mother. This means she will be able to eat without difficulty. She will be able to talk and people will be able to understand her. This opens up the world for Tracy.

Briyith

Brivith had to hold her nose to say "papa" and there were many words she cannot say. She got angry when she saw other children drinking from straws because she could not, due to her cleft palate.



When Brivith was born her mother had never seen a person with cleft lip or palate. The doctors ensured her that there were surgeries her daughter could receive, but did not show her any affordable options. GSF was the answer to her worries. She feels blessed because of all that Global Smile Foundation has given her and her daughter.

Yarixa

Yarixa's family cannot afford running water in their home, not to mention the various surgeries required for her cleft lip and palate.

Although she is only one year old and does not understand the change Global Smile Foundation is making in her life, her mother now feels much more confident in caring for Yarixa. She now understands how to feed and nurture her child.












Dyland

When we asked Dyland's mother what her biggest wish was she answered that she "wishes Global Smile Foundation never closes and [we] continue [our] great work."

When he was born the doctors told his family he would need 50 operations, none of which he could afford. This year GSF is performing his third, and likely final, surgery all of which were at no cost to his family.







When Sandy was born, her mother fainted. The doctors gave her no information on how to care for a child with cleft lip and cleft palate. She was not told that surgery was an option. She had never seen a person with any kind of cleft and did not know where to get information about it.



Global Smile Foundation changed all of that. We were able to give information on how to care for a child with cleft lip and palate, the surgeries required for Sandy to live a full life, and the support that her family needed.
